M. A. HART CUP COMPETITIONS ROUND UP

Priory Quays suffered their third semi final defeat in two years when Cobham Sports hit them with three goals in five devastating first half minutes to emerge 4-2 winners and progress to the **MARK HART SUNDAY SENIOR CUP** final. Richie Sands opened the scoring after 25 minutes with a neat glancing header from Sam Pekun's pinpoint cross and Tom Hall then burst through to lash home Cobham's second goal before Pekun tucked away the third goal himself on the half hour. Quay's misery continued when Sands drilled home his second goal of the game on the stroke of half time but they pulled one back just after the break through substitute Manny Ohameje and added a second in the closing stages with a Max Crow header.

Magdon Scaffolding are through to the quarter finals of the **M. A. HART ROBBINS CUP** after Josh Thompson (2) and Stanley Elad ensured a 3-1 success against Premier League rivals Parley Sports who replied through Toby Holmes.

Mark Pudney (2)(1pen) and Joshua Goncalves netted for Talbot Rangers but AFC Stourvale just got the better of them 4-3 thanks to Ali Garard's hat-trick and a goal from Travis Bussell.

Hundred per cent **DIVISION THREE** leaders Ensbury Park Rangers accounted for Boscombe Celtic 2-0 with goals from Josh Webb and Ben Wright and nearest rivals Fernside Sports remain seven points behind after Bradley Arthur (2), Joseph Selby, and Martin Johnson put paid to Vienna Manor Reserves 4-0.

Shaun Page put third placed Poole Wanderers in front but they took a 5-1 tumble against Wimborne Magpies whose goals came via Craig Moore, Michael Corbet, and a Jack White hat-trick.

UAB replace St Albans in the **DIVISION FOUR** runners up spot after upending them 2-0 with goals from Jordan Basing and Sean Heron .
