## HAMPSHIRE FA JOHN WARD SUNDAY SENIOR CUP FINAL

Hants Sunday Senior Cup Final (Winchester City)  
Talbot Rangers 1-3 Chamberlayne Athletic



Talbot Rangers hopes of bringing the Hampshire FA's JOHN WARD SUNDAY SENIOR CUP back to Bournemouth were dashed when they were beaten 3-1 by Chamberlayne Athletic from Southampton.

Rangers were undone by a slick move in the sixth minute when Chamberlayne's left winger Andrew Powell played the ball up the line to Marcus Bevan who crossed for Stefan Williams to slot the ball clinically inside the near post.

Rangers' best chance came twelve minutes into the second half when Mickey Finch put Dominic Falco clear but the striker's shot went narrowly wide.

Rangers' task was made more difficult when Mickey Finch received his marching orders in the 66<sup>th</sup> minute after receiving a second yellow card for a mistimed tackle.

Chamberlayne scored a second goal ten minutes later when Justyn Penfold fired a 20 yard effort into the top corner but they were also reduced to ten men with Stefan Williams, the scorer of their first goal, being shown a second yellow card for his over enthusiastic celebration.

Rangers were thrown a lifeline in the 87<sup>th</sup> minute when Jamie Morgan was pushed over in the penalty area and substitute Ashley Ayley drilled home the resultant spot kick but, with the game going into stoppage time, Nick Beattie raced through unopposed from the half way line to make it 3-1 to Chamberlayne.
