

HAYWARD SATURDAY LEAGUE ROUND UP

Reigning champions Bournemouth Manor returned to winning ways in the **HAYWARD SATURDAY PREMIER DIVISION** when they just got the better of AFC Burton 2-1.

Manor had previously gone three league games without a win for the first time in their six year Premier Division history. They bounced back with two excellent first half strikes from the lively Mickey Finch while Burton halved the deficit after the break through Levi Ridealgh.
