Reigning champions Bournemouth Manor go back on top of the HAYWARD SATURDAY PREMIER DIVISION on goal difference after Ryan Shaylor and Martin Sault gave them the edge 2-1 against Alderholt who replied through Alex Hamilton-Brain.

Gareth Barnes and Ben Mowlam bagged two apiece when Parley Sports completed their campaign with a 5-1 triumph over Redlynch & Woodfalls United. Craig Mowlam was the other Parley marksman with Michael Joy scoring the Redlynch consolation goal.

In the other Premier Division game, Luke McArdle struck twice in Bournemouth Electric's 4-2 success against Merley Cobham Sports with Paul Conroy and Tino Madziya adding one each.
