It wasn't the best of days for HAYWARD SATURDAY PREMIER DIVISION heavyweights



Bournemouth Sports and Bournemouth Manor for vastly different reasons ahead of their Thursday night showdown at Hurn Bridge in the M.A.Hart Pickford Cup Final. Ian Musselwhite slotted home a couple of penalties for Bournemouth Sports but the league leaders had to settle for a point when Mark Desborough and Harry Denyer earned Alderholt a 2-2 draw. Meanwhile Bournemouth Manor were trailing to goals from Lewis Mills and Daniel Sturgess against Bournemouth Electric (*Pic right*) when the game had to be abandoned after 22 minutes due to an ankle injury to Manor goalkeeper Liam Roberts which is likely to keep him out of action for between four and six months. Ben Palmer netted for Alderholt Reserves in DIVISION ONE but bottom placed Queens Park Athletic were 3-1 winners thanks to Jordan Monks and a couple of goals from Chris Cox. Athletic remain anchored to the bottom though as the team immediately above them, Portcastrian, also picked up three points, upending Fordingbridge Turks 4-1 with Tim Constable and Ben Virabi scoring two apiece. Dan Parker scored the consolation goal for Turks.

M.A.Hart Page Croft Cup winners Mundeford Mens Club continue to lead DIVISION TWO on goal difference after Liam Welton scored both goals in their 2-0 win over Bransgore United. Nearest rivals AFC Burton Reserves just got the better of Talbot Rise 3-2 thanks to Ryan Attree and a couple of goals from Ben Collie while Jake Hill and Callum Fowler scored two each to give Bisterne United Reserves the upper hand 4-2 against AFC Bransgore. Harry Stokes was the four goal star of Fordingbridge Turks Reserves' 6-2 drubbing of West Howe with Callum Fraser and John Bailey adding one each and Poole Borough were also 6-2 winners when Lee Green, Connor White, and Ben Lees bagged two each to subdue Westover Bournemouth Reserves.
