Priory Quays are back on top of the table after Steve Flynn and Max Crow gave them the edge 2-1 against Abbey who replied though Kev Collins.

Ethan Speechley-Price struck twice in NMO’s 3-0 success against Kinson Con with Anthony Seeley also on target for the Hayward League newcomers.

Jack Mills struck twice for brit Sports but East Christchurch SSC just got the better of them 3-2 thanks to Alex Whitehouse and a couple of goals from James Tunnicliffe.
