HAMPSHIRE CUP ROUND UP

Max Crow was the four goal star when Premier League pacesetters Priory Quays swept Itchen Saints aside 6-2 to reach the quarter finals of the **HAMPSHIRE SUNDAY SENIOR CUP** with Steve Flynn and Simon Tao adding one each.
