

Shocks in BDFA Camerons Cup

There were some big surprises in the **BDFA CAMERONS SUNDAY CUP** second round ties with no less than three Division Two sides bowing out to lower league opposition.

Carlos Galvis, Jaime Gil Martinez, Manny Ohameje, and Matt Justice struck for Kirkfield United who are currently unbeaten and in second place in Division Two but Nelson Athletic from Division Five held them 4-4 courtesy of a Leon Collins hat-trick and a goal from Josh Rose before easing Kirkfield out 4-3 on penalties.
