West Howe topple the Cup holders

There will be a different name on the **BDFA CAMERONS CUP** this season after the holders FC Hajduk were beaten 2-1 in the quarter finals by West Howe. Hajduk went close on a number of occasions but West Howe took a two goal lead following free kicks taken from a similar position by Jason Monks. The first one was converted by Sam Davis and the second, five minutes later, was flicked on by Sam Davis to the feet of Calvin Boscott who slammed it home. FC Hajduk pulled one back a couple of minutes from time through substitute Lewis Sainval but it was too late to prevent West Howe going through to the semi finals where they will meet East Christchurch Athletic at KGVPF on Sunday 24th March.



East Christchurch SSC are also through following their 3-1 success against Grange Athletic. Dan Hancock gave East Christchurch the lead after eleven minutes and Elliott Hartnell-Baker added a second ten minutes later.
