# **B DFA final is an East Christchurch derby**

The **B DFA CAMERONS CUP** final will be an East Christchurch derby after both Grange Road based sides were victorious in their respective semi finals.

Substitute Dave Midgeley struck twice in East Christchurch SSC's 6-1 triumph over Victoria Park Rangers with Aidan Blackburn, Levi Ridealgh, and substitutes Alex Whitehouse and Kieran Davies adding one each while Mason McDermott scored the consolation goal for the Division Two side. SSC are now in four cup finals, the first of which takes place this Thursday when they meet FC Hajduk in the Mark Hart Sunday Senior Cup final. They then meet FC Hajduk again on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> April in the M.A. Hart Robbins Cup and East Christchurch Athletic on Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> April in the B DFA Camerons Cup final before going to Basingstoke on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> May to play The Meon in the Hampshire FA John Ward Sunday Senior Cup final.



East Christchurch Athletic had the best possible start in the other semi final when Adam Frohlich opened the scoring in the second minute of their 3-0 success against West Howe and this was soon followed by their second goal from River Smith. Ethan Fishlock added the third midway through the first half with a stunning effort from just outside the penalty area and, although they were able to staunch the flow of goals, West Howe were unable to loosen Athletic's grip on the game.
