Great start for Senior Cup holders

MARK HART SUNDAY SENIOR CUP holders East Christchurch SSC began their defence of the trophy with a 6-0 triumph over Rushmere in their Group One game. Tino Maher opened the scoring with a 6th minute strike and a couple of goals in quick succession midway through the first half from Elliott Hartnell-Baker and Alex Hancox put the holders firmly in the driving seat. Levi Ridealgh added a fourth from the penalty spot and Elliott Hartnell-Baker scored his second goal of the game just before the interval. Rushmere had the misfortune to lose players early in the game through injury but managed to staunch the flow of goals after the break until SSC's new signing Adam James rounded off the scoring in the closing stages.
