Emphatic first defence for FC Hajduk

Henry Hodge struck twice when **JOHN WARD SUNDAY SENIOR CUP** holders FC Hajduk overwhelmed Newton Heath 1977 7-0 as they began their defence of the trophy in the first round with Jack Kinge-Phillips, Howard Nhemachena, Awwal Abubakar, and substitute Will Hodge adding one each.
