Then, three minutes later, an Alex Whitehouse cross found Mitch East who laid it off for Alexandru Catana to put them ahead with a shot that went in off the inside of both posts. Kraken had East Christchurch on the back foot in the last 20 minutes but, always dangerous on the counter attack, SSC put the result beyond doubt in stoppage time with a Levi Ridealgh penalty after he had been brought down in the box.

East Christchurch SSC will play West Howe in the Hurn Bridge final on Thursday 14th April but they will be visiting Hurn Bridge before that when they meet FC Hajduk in the Mark Hart Sunday Senior Cup Final on Thursday 30th March.
