HAMPSHIRE CUP COMPETITIONS

SSC PREVAIL IN CRAZY CUP TIE AT TOTTON.

East Christchurch SSC, who were beaten JOHN WARD SUNDAY SENIOR CUP finalists last season, were involved in a crazy first round tie away to West Totton Wanderers. After being 2-0 down at half time, Levi Ridealgh and substitute Ollie Bull (a goalkeeper by trade) bagged two each for SSC in a remarkable second half with Jamie Trimble also on target with a stoppage time equaliser to take the game to penalties at 5-5. With goalkeeper Dan Barker pulling off two superb saves in the shoot out, SSC squeezed through 4-3 on penalties.

Rushmere certainly drew the short straw when they came out of the hat with a home tie against cup holders The Meon. To make matters worse, the Red Dragons had to play an hour of the game with ten men after Nahuel Molina saw red following his second yellow card.
