SSC prevail in Hampshire Senior Cup semi

East Christchurch SSC were 4-1 winners against local rivals East Christchurch Athletic in their **HAMPSHIRE FA JOHN WARD SUNDAY SENIOR CUP** semi final at Grange Road. Jamie Trimble gave SSC a 15th minute lead with a far post header from a free kick but Athletic replied with an equaliser from Adam Frohlich following a corner kick. Athletic had a good spell of pressure but, with half time approaching, SSC regained the lead when Levi Ridealgh broke away down the left and crossed for substitute Elliott Hartnell-Baker to steer home a header. Athletic were awarded a penalty just before the interval but SSC 'keeper Pete Old dived to his left to save River Smith's spot kick. Athletic continued to dominate at the start of the second half but Alex Hancox eventually increased SSC's lead following a goalmouth scramble and he struck again five minutes later to put the result beyond doubt.



SSC are through to their second final in three seasons where they will play The Meon from the City of Portsmouth Sunday League at Basingstoke on Sunday 15th May (4.30pm). The Meon put SSC out at the quarter final stage last season which was SSC's only defeat in the competition in three years.
