

## HAYWARD SATURDAY LEAGUE ROUND UP - SATURDAY 28<sup>th</sup> SEPTEMBER 2019

Queens Park Athletic hold top spot in the **HAYWARD SATURDAY PREMIER DIVISION** despite going down 3-2 to Westover Bournemouth in an action packed top of the table clash. Westover's Rory Ward broke the deadlock after 55 minutes and their goalkeeper Rob Voysey made amends for giving away a penalty ten minutes later by saving the resultant spot kick.



Martin Smith put QPA on terms with an 75<sup>th</sup> minute header and he went close again nine minutes later before Westover went straight down the other end to restore their lead through Kyle Allman. Rory Ward scored his second of the game for Westover in the 89<sup>th</sup> minute while QPA's Ollie Ledsham pulled it back to 3-2 in stoppage time.

Bournemouth Electric join QPA and Westover at the top on nine points when Tim Constable and Abraham Adesoji bagged two each to give them the upper hand 4-2 against Ringwood Town Development squad who replied through Harrison Clarke and Dan Hawkins.

Meanwhile Ed Ewens and Luke Scrimshaw nabbed two apiece in Bournemouth Manor's 6-0 triumph over Mudeford Mens Club with Scott Pilcher and Mark Wheeler adding one each.

Hundred per cent Bisterne United are five points clear at the top of **DIVISION ONE** after Sam Hills (2), Luke Gogan, and Charlie King gave them the edge 4-3 against Westover Bournemouth Reserves who replied through Connor Picken and a couple of goals from Kieron Goldrick.

Verwood All Stars Development squad lead the chasing pack after their 7-1 drubbing of AFC Burton. Cal Botterill and Yusuf Akanni bagged two each with the other goals coming via Liam McNally, Cavan James, and Kebba Balajo. Casey Bonsfield scored the Burton consolation goal.

There were braces from both Sean Eaton and Tylor Burgis in Talbot Rise's 6-1 victory over FC Barolo. Aidan Reynolds and Nick Thomas added one each for Talbot with Barolo replying courtesy of a Liam Vincent own goal.

Bournemouth Electric Reserves were 4-1 winners against New Milton Eagles thanks to Adam Louka, Ben Hatch, and a couple of goals from Lee Pearson. Shahed Miah was the Eagles marksman.

In the other Division One game Lee Kirby, Cal Fraser, and Alex Marshall netted for Fordingbridge Turks but they had to settle for a point when Timi Touiho, Connor Mitchell, and Callum Zikmund earned Winkton Athletic a creditable 3-3 draw.
