ALDERNEY LEAD DIVISION ONE AFTER BIG THREE ALL DROP POINTS

The big match in the Sunday League saw **DIVISION ONE** heavyweights Loch & Quay and Talbot Rangers go head to head and it finished all square with Steve Flynn's strike just before the interval for Rangers cancelled out twelve minutes into the second half when Olly Balmer equalised direct from a corner kick.

With Abbey held to a 0-0 draw by West Howe, Alderney Manor found themselves on top of the table with maximum points after Toby Williams, Sam Thompson and Liam Holland gave them the edge 3-2 against AFC East Christchurch. Conrad Churchill and Jordan Chaffey were the Christchurch scorers.

Bournemouth Athletic goalkeeper Bailey Middleton saved a penalty against East Christchurch SSC but he was unable to prevent the visitors running out 3-0 winners with goals from Jonny King, Jamie Trimble and Levi Ridealgh.
