SECOND SEMI FINAL SUCCESS FOR ATHLETIC

Mark Hart Sunday Senior Cup finalists East Christchurch Athletic are also through to the M.A. HART ROBBINS CUP final after just getting the better of giant killers Parkstone Club 3-2 in an action packed semi final.



The Division Three side had already recorded three impressive successes against top flight opposition in Cup Competitions this season and started confidently. Frankie Shears put them on terms after Athletic had taken an early lead through Bradley Penhallow. But Athletic took control with two goals in the closing stages of the first half from Lewis Keeping before they were reduced to ten men when Ryan King saw red just before half time. Athletic regrouped and saw the second half out although Parkstone did eventually reduce the deficit in stoppage time through Tommy Cameron.

Max Wilcock struck twice to give Kraken Sports the edge 3-2 in their quarter final with East Christchurch SSC. Tyler Rudd was the other Kraken marksman with SSC replying through Elliott Hartnell-Baker and Dan Hancock. Kraken's opponents in the semi final will be the winners of the fourth round tie between Rushmere and New Forest Rangers.

Josh Taylor bagged a brace in New Forest Rangers' 5-1 third round victory over Churchill (formerly known as Tavern) with Josh Stoodley, Leon Collins, and Tom Kendall adding one each. Sam Thompson scored the consolation goal for Churchill.
