East Christchurch SSC raised the Bournemouth League standard on foreign soil when they powered their way into the last eight of the **FA SUNDAY CUP** with a 3-0 fourth round victory over Broadwater at Littlehampton. After an even first half, the reigning Hayward Sunday League champions moved up a gear after the break. New signing Mal Thomas opened the scoring in the 52nd minute, capitalising on a defensive error to beat the offside trap and slot the ball home. East Christchurch doubled their lead on the hour when Harry Smith's long throw in took the hosts by surprise and Alex Whitehouse was unmarked at the far post to apply the finishing touch. The game was up for Broadwater after 78 minutes when a Harry Smith cross picked out Jamie Trimble who headed home the third goal.
